


An International Division Member Connection, November 2024

Fellow International Educator,

About two years ago, I noticed a large clump of debris piling up in the creek that runs through the rustic park near our home in Colorado. I assumed it was from some minor flash flooding, so I wrote to the Parks Department to alert them so a clean-up effort could be organized. The response from the city surprised me. No, the piles were not caused by flash flooding; a colony of beavers had moved in and built a dam (and no cleanup would be organized). That began a fascination on my part that has lasted to this day. Since then, I've observed hundreds of trees chopped (chewed?) down and dam after dam built, up and down the creek. I wish I were still teaching 8th grade; this would make for fantastic science walks. The funny thing was that in my two years of observation, one thing eluded me for the longest time. I never saw a single beaver. I didn't doubt they were there because I saw the evidence: bite marks on trees and stumps, chips on the ground, felled trees, cut branches moved into place, dams built and rebuilt, but no beavers! And then suddenly, a few months ago, near dusk, I finally saw a beaver and not just one. There they were, a male, a female, and their cute little pup, but just that once.





Since joining ACSI Global, I've often told people that the best part of my job is having a front-row seat to see God at work through international Christian schooling. Over and over, at every school I visit, it's not hard to see God at work in your school. He builds, He creates, He tears down, and He restores. But like my colony of beavers, I don't see HIM with my eyes, but I know He is there because I see the evidence of his work in and through you, His servants. We know this because in John 5:17, "Jesus said to them, 'My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working.'"

Keep at it today.



Hurricane Helene and Milton both left debris and devastation behind, leaving area schools without power, water, and a place to have a normal school day. While ACSI received many reports after the storms, Asheville Christian Academy (Swannanoa, NC), Augusta Christian Schools (Martinez, GA), Curtis Baptist School (Augusta, GA), and Tri-County Christian School (Spruce Pine, NC) have been the most damaged. Yet, we are stronger together.

Through the ACSI Cares Crisis Response Fund, individuals and schools have given in support of these recent recovery efforts. ACSI has already disbursed initial dollars to help immediate needs and will continue to pass along donations in the future.

Beyond giving, ACSI member schools have taken this moment to help their students live out their faith through creative and innovative ways, such as making cards of encouragement, collecting babysitting money, or having a bake sale. Ninth graders from Faith Christian Academy in West Virginia sponsored a dress-down/bake sale and gave all their proceeds of \$1,165.72 to crisis response. Some schools have given \$5,000, while individuals have given heartfelt gifts of \$25.
